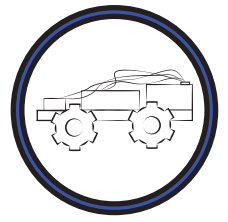
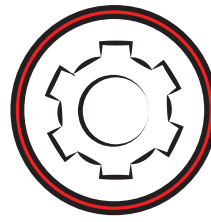


Mission 220

Mission 220 will provide over \$2000 worth of equipment, supplies, and training per school including:

- 2 VEX-IQ competition robotics kits
- Engineering notebook pack
- Challenge game pieces
- 2 day teacher workshop in their geographic region
- On-going support during the year from SCORE and the REC foundation

Each accepted school will commit to the following:

- Recruiting a diverse group of students to participate on the team(s) (target of 4-7 students per team)
- Sending 2 teachers to the teacher workshop
- Register a team for each kit received at www.robotevents.org.
- Participating in a minimum of one VEX-IQ tournament each year for the next two years

A qualified school meets the following criteria:

- Located in AL, TN, MS, GA, LA
- Rural, urban, and/or public schools with Title 1 status
- School houses one or more of grades 4th - 8th
